Discussion Item

District-wide Capital Improvements

Assistant Superintendent for Business Services Dr. Jeff O'Connell and Director of Operations and Maintenance Bob Ungaro lead a discussion on proposed summer 2016 capital improvement projects.

Performance Services responded to a Request for Proposal that included various HVAC improvements and other district-wide renovation needs. The report furnished outlines detailed information pertaining to the current condition of the equipment and the proposed solution. The total cost for this multi-campus project is\$2,048,255.00. The Administration has reviewed this information with the Building Committee and Finance Committee.

Performance Services also provided an Alternate Solar Project Solution. This project would consist of the installation of solar panels on the roofs at both campuses. Further detailed discussion is necessary with the experts to ensure this solution provides the District with a positive return on its investment and is a solution that will stand the test of time. If the District receives the Qualified School Construction Bond Designation, a meeting will be set with the experts to discuss a solar initiative.

Superintendent's Report

Dr. Panega previewed assessment updates, additional science testing requirements and commended staff for a successful Institute Day.

- The Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE) recently awarded test administration of the college entrance exam for all juniors to the College Board who produces the Scholastic Achievement Test (SAT). The State's decision to shift from the ACT to the SAT remains unfunded at this time, leaving districts to make local decisions. Lake Park will use approximately \$34,000 in local money to fund the ACT for juniors on April 19, because their academic preparation has been aligned to ACT readiness. The 2015-16 school year represents the last time that Lake Park will offer the ACT funded through local dollars due to ISBE's adoption of the SAT. The transition to the SAT begins this spring with PSAT testing for freshmen and sophomores on April 19 and full implementation in 2016-17 with ninth grade placement testing.
- ISBE announced a required online science assessment to high school students for content aligned to Biology I and AP Biology. The testing window will be open during May 2016. More information is needed before testing preparation begins.
- Several administrators and 30+ staff members were commended for planning and presenting during the "Best Practices for the Use of Instructional Technology" Institute Day on January 25. Licensed staff had the opportunity to participate in three sessions ranging from topics such as using Google Drive, Google Apps and Chromebooks 101. This powerful professional development day helps pave the way for 1:1 implementation for the Class of 2020.

Action Item Implementation of Premium Day Substitute Pay

Assistant Superintendent for Educational Services Mike Wojtowicz presented information how Lake Park, similar to many local school districts and other districts nationwide, struggles to find enough substitute teachers to fill daily teacher and instructional aide vacancies.

While the substitute teacher pool is larger today than it was a year ago when the daily pay rate for substitutes increased, the District still struggles to fill vacancies on days when the need for substitutes is high.

In an attempt to address the campus substitute teacher needs on high demand days, the Board of Education approved the recommendation to implement premium substitute pay rates on those days deemed "high demand" by the campuses.

The pay structure will be implemented immediately with the intention of incentivizing substitutes to work at Lake Park on days when coverage needs are high.
