Teacher Evaluation

The Lake Park Licensed Staff Evaluation Plan is aligned to the Danielson Framework for Professional Practice. The process of teacher appraisal supports improved instruction through the understanding and application of effective instructional practices. The goal is to improve student achievement and to ensure quality instruction. Teacher evaluation is designed for the following purposes:

- To promote professional growth based on a positive and collaborative approach among licensed staff and administrators
- To improve instruction and performance through differentiated professional growth
- To support individual goal setting and self-reflection
- To assess adherence to standards for professional practice
- To provide a basis for employment recommendations including assignment, transfer, retention, and promotion
- To comply with the provisions of Section 24A of the *Illinois School Code*

Assessment

Assessment plays a critical role in measuring student learning and improving classroom instruction.

Lake Park uses formative assessment (assessment for student learning) and summative assessment (assessment of student learning) in the learning process. Lake Park will:

- Utilize formative and summative assessments in the ongoing evaluation of each student's academic needs, progress and placement
- Analyze district and classroom level data to evaluate programs and progress towards meeting district goals
- Implement common assessments and analyze student performance data to make decisions relating to curriculum, instruction, and assessment
- Analyze student achievement data to identify priorities for staff development and academic interventions
