- Rakhi Mistry I presented at the West Suburban Math Institute at Glenbard North Feb 28th on "Mindfulness and Math Anxiety." Research has proven that there is a direct correlation to student success in math when educators address the fears students have that have been engrained from years of "not being good at math." We looked at three specific ways to change student mindset: journaling, affirmations, and meditation. We discussed how to implement these three interventions before class assessments. - Alanda Mehic and Margaret Gawrych On February 7th, Algebra 3 students attended a field trip to the College of DuPage. Students saw a presentation from the admissions office, counseling, and student services. The students found COD's 3+1 bachelor's degree program very interesting. In partnership with schools such as Benedictine University, Concordia University, Roosevelt University, and more, students are able to receive a 4 year degree by paying COD's tuition for 3 years and the University's for 1 year, all while attending COD's campus.
