This packet contains information students should read <u>before</u> applying for a scholarship administered by the Lake Park High School Educational Foundation. Students will find information about the various scholarships available and the specific requirements for each scholarship.

Following is a brief description of the Foundation-administered scholarships.

Altier Scholarship - \$500 will be awarded to four graduating students planning to pursue a two-year degree program at the College of DuPage, another community college, or attend an accredited trade school. (Pages 5-6)

Alumni Scholarship - \$500 will be awarded to two graduating students planning to attend an accredited trade school, technical institute, community college, or four-year college/university. (Pages 7-8)

Amanda Jane Dombrowski Memorial Scholarship - \$2000 will be awarded to a graduating student planning to attend an accredited trade school, technical institute, community college, or four-year college/university program leading to a certificate or degree; who is a current member of the Lake Park High School girls' soccer team and displayed leadership and sportsmanship while serving as a positive role model for younger players; and who displayed a passion and commitment to the LPHS soccer program. Barclay Family Scholarship - \$1000 will be awarded to a graduating student planning to attend a fouryear accredited college/university, community college, technical institute, or accredited trade school. (Pages 11-12)

Chris Frizzelle Memorial Scholarship - \$500 will be awarded to two graduating students who are currently members of the boys' soccer team; who overcame or are attempting to overcome some type of challenge; and who plan to attend an accredited trade school, technical institute, community college, or four-year college/university program leading to a certificate or degree. (Pages 13-14)

Cychosz Scholarship - \$1,000 will be awarded to a graduating student planning to attend an accredited college/university program leading to a certificate or degree, who demonstrates financial need, and who plans to major in education, public service, engineering, or science. (Pages 15-16)

Don Lovelace Memorial Scholarship - \$1000 will be awarded to a graduating student planning to attend an accredited four-year college/university program leading to a certificate or degree and major in health, driver education, physical education, or related fields. (Pages 17-18)

Dr. Gary Annunziata Scholarship - \$500 will be awarded to two graduating students planning to attend the College of DuPage. (Pages 19-20)

G. H. Elliott Memorial Scholarship - \$500 will be awarded to a graduating student who has been accepted as a full-time student in an industrial technology or vocational degree or certificate program at an accredited school. (Pages 21-22)

The Gene Haas Foundation Scholarship - \$1000 will be awarded to four graduating students who plan to attend an accredited trade school, technical institute, community college, or four-year college/university program leading to a certificate or degree in manufacturing, machining, or engineering. (Pages 23-24)

Dan Hildebrandt Memorial Scholarship - \$500 will be awarded to one graduating student on the boys' tennis team, one graduating student on the girls' tennis team, and one graduating student on the girls' badminton team (3 total scholarships) planning to enroll in an accredited trade school, technical institute, community college, or four-year college/university program leading to a certificate or degree. Itasca Lions Club Scholarship - \$500 will be awarded to two graduating community service-oriented students from Itasca who are planning to attend an accredited four-year college/university or community college and who preferably desire to pursue a field of study that would help them foster a more humanitarian world. (Pages 27-28)

Lake Park Foundation EXCEL Scholarship - \$1000 will be awarded to four graduating students who demonstrated excellence while at Lake Park High School; who plan to enroll in a four-year college/university or junior/community college; and who participated in athletics, activities, and or community service activities. (Pages 29-30)

Lake Park Foundation Gene Swierczewski Scholarship - \$1000 will be awarded to a graduating student planning to attend an Illinois public state college or university and major in Languages, English, Political Science, Sociology, or Communications. (Pages 31-32)

Scott Bradley Memorial Scholarship - \$1500 will be awarded to a graduating student who was a member of the Lake Park High School wrestling team that plans to attend an accredited four-year college/university program leading to a degree. <u>Please note that this scholarship application is due on</u> <u>Thursday, February 1, 2018.</u> (Pages 33-34)
