Did you know?



- More than 25% of all District 502 high school graduates attend College of DuPage at some point during their college career
- College of DuPage is the largest single-campus community college in Illinois
- This semester, we have approximately 27,000 students enrolled in courses
- Although we have 27,000 students enrolled, our average class size is 19 students per class

Affordable Tuition

For Residents of District 502

- *\$137 per credit hour*
- Example: Psychology 1100 (3 credit hours)
 $\$137 \times 3 \text{ credit hours} = \411

If you plan to attend full-time, you must take at least 12 credits per semester (Average full-time load is 15 credits per semester)

Tuition Cost (for one semester): $\$137$ (per credit hour) \times 15 (hours) = **\$2,055**

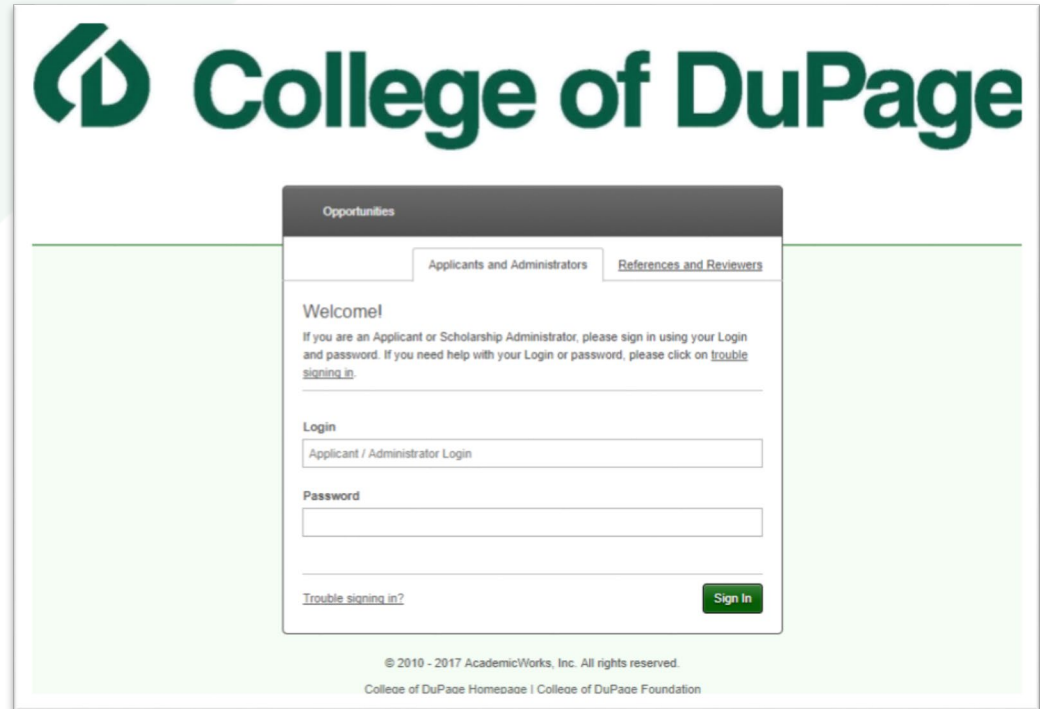
Tuition Cost (full year): $\$2,055 \times 2$ (semesters) = **\$4,110**

Applying for COD Scholarships

- Deadlines to Apply for Scholarships:
 - Fall Term: Due in March (Open in January)
 - Spring Term: Due in November

Scholars Award Program

To qualify for one of the scholarships, the applicant must be a 2017-18 Community College District 502 High School Graduate and meet **one** of the below criteria.

Presidential Scholars Award: 2 years of full in-district tuition

- 3.8 GPA/4.0 scale or 4.75 GPA/5.0 scale
- 29 ACT or 1350 SAT

Board of Trustees Scholars Award: \$2,500 per year

- 3.6 GPA/4.0 scale or 4.5 GPA/5.0 scale
- 27 ACT or 1280 SAT

Deans Scholars Award: \$1,000 per year

- 3.5 GPA/4.0 scale or 4.37 GPA /5.0 scale
- 25 ACT or 1200 SAT

Priority Fall Deadline: November

Spring Application Deadline: April 1st*

Early Admissions Program

Early Admissions program acceptance is determined on a case-by-case basis

To participate as an Early Admissions student, you must meet the following requirements:

- Be under the age of 18 without a high school diploma or GED
- Have a cumulative minimum high school GPA of 2.75 on a 4.0 scale or 3.75 on a 5.0 scale
- Meet all regular prerequisites for the desired course
- Obtain permission from your high school guidance counselor
- Interview with an Admissions Representative and bring any required documents

Degrees & Certificates



- College of DuPage offers more than 230 degree and certificate programs!
- Our graduates transfer to some of the best colleges and four-year universities across the country
- Start by earning a transfer degree (AA, AS, AES, AFA) and then go on for a bachelor's degree at a four-year institution
- Earn an AAS (associate of applied science) degree in an occupational or technical program (CTE)

Limited Enrollment Programs



- Students applying to a limited-enrollment, health sciences program will also be required to apply for general admission to College of DuPage
 - When students are ready to complete the Health Sciences Application, there is a \$50 application fee
- Some health sciences programs require attendance at an advising session

Engineering Pathways Program

- In partnership with University of Illinois, Urbana-Champaign, students who are accepted into the Engineering Pathways program will have guaranteed acceptance to UIUC after completing 2 years at COD
- Students must achieve a B or higher for all required courses. A minimum 3.5/4.0 GPA is required for transfer to UIUC
- Admission into the program is highly competitive to ensure the students entering the program are the most likely to succeed
- Special scholarships for Engineering Pathways transfer students are available
- Deadline to apply is March 15th

3+1 Program Tuition Costs

4 years tuition at Benedictine	2 years at COD, 2 years at Benedictine	3+1 Program (Nursing)

4 years tuition at Concordia	2 years at COD, 2 years at Concordia	3+1 Program (Health Care Management)

4 years tuition at Lewis	2 years at COD, 2 years at Lewis	3+1 Program (CIS & CIT)
\$103,080	\$59,540	\$29,160

2+2 Transfer Programs

Traditional 2+2 Agreement

Student completes 2 years at COD and the final 2 years at our partner college/university to complete a bachelor's degree

Enhanced 2+2 Agreement

Student completes up to 90 semester credits of coursework (mostly general education courses), and then transfers to complete the remaining credits toward a bachelor's degree at a four-year college/university

Task	Start date	Suggested dates	Deadline
Apply	Any time! The sooner the better.	January	Day classes begin
Complete Financial Aid	October 1st of each year	As early as possible	At Least 1 month before registering for classes
Take Placement Tests	After accepted	March/April of Senior Year	Before registering for classes
Set up your MyAccess	After Accepted	Immediately after acceptance letter	1 week before classes begin
Meet with an Advisor	After placement testing	April	N/A
Register for Classes	Late April	EARLY	Day before classes begin
Select a Payment Option	Must be done the day you register for classes or you will be dropped! No exceptions!

Take all Necessary Placement Tests

- Three Required Placement Tests:
 - Reading
 - Writing
 - Math
- What waives a student from taking the Reading & Writing Placement Test:
 - 20 ACT Composite or higher
 - 950 SAT or higher
 - 2.6/4.0 or 3.25/5.0 scale cumulative GPA
- What **MAY** waive a student from taking the ALEKS Math Placement Test:
 - 23 or higher ACT Math subset score
 - No SAT score is applicable for waiving the math placement

If you are transferring more than 12 credit hours from another college/university or enrolling in a CTE program, you may not need to take placement tests

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
