Presentations

- Assistant Principal for Athletics and Alternative Education Pete Schauer presented a [co-curricular report that recognized individual and team accomplishments](#). For these winter student athletes, 70 achieved the prestigious Dupage Valley Conference (DVC) All-Academic recognition by maintaining an overall GPA of 4.5 or higher. Furthermore, seven teams earned the IHSA All-Academic Team award with an overall combined GPA of 4.0 or higher.

Recognition was given to the Boys Bowling team, Competitive Cheer team, Lancettes team, Girls Gymnastics team, and individual athletes from Girls Basketball, Girls Bowling, Boys Swimming, and Wrestling. - Dominic Manola, Assistant Principal for Instructional Innovation and Activities, introduced the student leaders who were instrumental in planning activities for the March 14th National School Walkout Day as well as production of a [video message to raise awareness for the importance of school safety](#). These student-led efforts voiced support for the victims in the February 14, 2018 school shooting in Parkland, FL.



Discussion Items

Board Policy Manual: Introducing New Policies

For first reading and discussion, Assistant Superintendent for Educational Services Mike Wojtowicz introduced Policy 5.100 (Staff Development Program) that addresses the required implementation of specific biennial staff development requirements as prescribed by federal and state laws. In addition, he introduced Policy 5.280 (Educational Support Personnel - Duties and Qualifications) addressing the duties and qualifications of the District's educational support personnel, coaches, and athletic trainers.

Action Item

The [recommended student registration fees](#) for the 2018-19 school year, as presented at the February 26, 2018 Board of Education meeting, were approved. The increase is aligned to the December 2016 Consumer Price Index (CPI) of 2.1 percent. The Driver Education Summer School Fee, Summer School Fee, and Summer Bridge Fee increases will take effect for programs offered during 2018 summer school.

Superintendent's Report

Superintendent Dr. Lynn Panega and Principal John Gouriotis shared highlights about the impact of student involvement during the National School Walkout on March 14 and how the actions united the community. Approximately 1000 students districtwide participated in the walkout and were extremely respectful. At West Campus, Lancers silently held hands and formed a loop in solidarity around the front plaza for 17 minutes. At East Campus, students exited to the back stadium and walked several loops around the track. Students remaining inside the building watched the [video message](#). All demonstrated "The Lancer Way" with their actions.

The Roselle, Bloomingdale, Itasca and Hanover Park police departments were commended for ensuring a safe environment in which to display support for the Parkland community. Following a debrief of the planning and execution, discussion began for the national walkout proposed on April 20, which marks the 19-year anniversary of Columbine High School.
