Discussion Items

Revisions to Board Policy 7.60—Residency

Lake Park administrators and registrars are in the process of reviewing the District's residency policy, guidelines and forms. As recommended by legal counsel, revised Board Policy 7.60 was presented for first reading and discussion.

Action Items

Negotiated Agreement Between the BOE and LPEA

The Board of Education approved the four-year agreement reached at the Negotiations Committee meeting on April 30. The Lake Park Education Association membership voted to approve this agreement at a meeting held on May 16. The agreement is effective for four years, FY2019-2022.

New Course Proposal

The Board of Education approved Curriculum Council's recommendation of a new course proposal for implementation in the 2019-20 school year.

 Calculus 3 - a one-year course offered at West Campus for students who have completed an accelerated sequence of math courses. Students who earn a 4 or 5 on the AP Calculus BC exam may enroll in this course for dual credit with Indiana University.

2019-20 Academic Calendar

The Board of Education approved the <u>academic calendar for the 2019-20</u> <u>academic year</u>. The calendar reflects a start date that is one week later than usual to accommodate the BMW Championship that will be hosted at Medinah Country Club the week of August 12, 2019.

Athletico, Inc. Contract

Board members approved a three-year contract with the district's current provider, Athletico, for athletic training services.

East Campus Dance Room Renovation and Fitness Room Expansion

The Board approved bids for East Campus renovations to include installation of windows and a new doorway between the existing dance room and existing weight room, installation of cable for TVs, and raising the current lighting up to the ceiling for sufficient clearance.

Furniture for East Campus Collaboration Center

Board members approved bids for flexible furniture to configure the former East Campus computer lab into a unique instructional space for both staff and students.

Action Items

Following Closed Session, the Board of Education voted to approve:

- <u>Safety and Security Personnel Structure</u>
- Protective safety film product districtwide installation on windows and doors, including classroom door sidelights
- New video surveillance system update to IP-based architecture system replacing existing system installed in 2004
- FY19 Administrative and Confidential Support Staff Compensation

- The Class of 2018 celebrated a safe prom this past weekend and will finish the year with Scholarship and Awards Night on May 24 and graduation on May 31 at 7 p.m. at the Sears Centre Arena in Hoffman Estates. The last final full day of school for seniors will be May 23.
- Lake Park is proud to once again be involved in the community-wide project, Flags for Roselle, which will kickoff the 2nd annual installation of U.S. flags to 250 subscribers on May 28. Supporting the 15 volunteer teams will be a total of 17 Lancer students, who comprise four LP teams from the Veterans Service Organization Club. Memorial Day represents the first of five holidays the flag installation occurs throughout Roselle (other holidays include: Flag Day, Independence Day, Patriot's Day, Veterans' Day).
- Juniors who took the Illinois statewide SAT test on April 10, 2018 can now access their scores online via the district's Home Access Center (HAC) or the College Board. By accessing scores, students can establish a Khan Academy account that will allow them to track their scores over time, send scores to colleges, and receive access to a variety of free online SAT prep resources.

Additionally, the test scores from the April 10 administration of the PSAT 9 and PSAT 10 assessments are also accessible via HAC. These test results will provide families with a snapshot of the progress their student is making towards college and career readiness.
