#### **Discussion Item**

#### Fiscal Year Budget 2018-19

Assistant Superintendent for Business Services Dr. Jeff O'Connell presented a tentative draft of the Fiscal Year 2018-19 budget. The administrative team will continue to monitor year-end activities associated with Fiscal Year 2017-18. The FY19 budget has been developed based on a number of assumptions related to the Consumer Price Index, General State Aid and health insurance premiums. The administration will monitor the State of Illinois budget process making changes as necessary, and present the FY19 budget at the September 2018 Board meeting.

## **Action Items**

### Revision to Board Policy 7.60: Residency

Following the first reading of Board Policy 7.60 (Residency) at the May 21, 2018 Board of Education meeting, members voted to approve the policy, which will be sent to the Illinois Association of School Boards (IASB) for online posting.

#### Purchase of Eight Driver Education Vehicles

The Board of Education approved the purchase of eight used vehicles with limited mileage from Friendly Ford. The purchase was necessary due to driver education vehicles flooding in the East Campus south maintenance garage area following heavy rain during a brief period of time on May 30, 2018. Due to excessive water damage, the district's third party administrator and an appraiser deemed the vehicles a total loss.

# Superintendent's Report

Dr. Panega shared summer curricular opportunities for students as well as professional development and capital improvement highlights.

- First semester summer school ends this week; second semester begins the week of July 9. Students have the opportunity to earn make-up credits due to failure, take classes for credit acceleration including Honors Geometry, Civics (first time) and Consumer Education, and to build skills in preparation for courses during the school year through a variety of boot camps.
- Lake Park is again offering two camps for middle school students with a focus on STEM including GADGET (Girls Adventuring in Design Engineering and Technology) as well as Lancer Tek which focuses on engineering and precision machining.
- Staff remain engaged throughout the summer with 60 teachers participating in curriculum development, technology training, and Social Emotional Learning professional development. Lake Park will host the Illinois Teachers of Foreign Language conference in July which focuses on assessment.
- Special thanks to the custodial and maintenance staff who are working hard to ensure capital improvement projects remain in process and on schedule.

Lake Park Board of Education meeting, students in activities and athletics were recognized for their achievements during the spring season.
